History

- Manor Fields were used by Manor School up to its closure in 1995
- In 1999 a planning application was submitted to build 23 houses on the North field
- A successful campaign was mounted to overturn the application
- In 2004 a 25 year management lease was signed by Manor Fields Association with Derbyshire County Council retaining ownership
- In 2007 Charitable Status was achieved
- In 2012 Derbyshire County Council transferred ownership to Manor Fields Association

Progress so far...

- We encourage Junior teams to play on the North field football pitch
- The fields are used on a daily basis for strolling, jogging and dog walking
- The fields have been used by Sheffield Hallam University students as a project for the MSc Conservation course
- Local schoolchildren have undertaken environmental projects on the fields
- New shrubs & trees are being planted and wildlife monitored
